





## HOW YOU CAN PROMOTE THE NATIONAL PASSENGER SAFETY CAMPAIGN

## **ENCOURAGE PEOPLE TO SPEAK UP:**

- Publicize this campaign on your social media platforms
- Start a campaign in your area by encouraging groups and organizations to support National Passenger Safety Week
- Encourage companies to educate their employees and associates to SPEAK UP when their life is threatened by an unsafe driver.
- Urge your partner organizations and members to sign the "Courage to Intervene" (CTI) Promise. You are welcome to add the NPSW logo along with your own on the CTI Promise.
- Contact your state and federal representatives for resolutions declaring the last week in January as National Passenger Safety Week
- Develop your own Instagram reels, videos, social posts and sayings publicizing your ideas for this campaign.
- Use the hashtags #passengersspeakup #passengersafety #passengerempowerment #driversbeware #nationalpassengersafety
- Share the National Passenger Safety Logo on your website

## QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR TEEN BEFORE THEY BECOME A PASSENGER:

- How old is the driver?
- Does the driver have a valid driver's license?
- How much experience do they have driving and how long have they been driving?
- How long have they been driving?
- Is the car in good working condition?
- Are they wearing seat belts in the car?
- Will you promise to always buckle up?
- Do they like to speed?
- Do we know the driver of the vehicle?
- If not, are they willing to meet with us when they pick you up?
- Will they give us your destination, and will you call us if there is a change in plans?
- Do you have your proper identification with you, just in case something happens?
- Will the driver share with us their parents' contact info?
- How many other passengers will be in the car?
- What time will you be home?
- Will you promise to call me if the driver is under the influence so I can pick you up?
- Do you know if the driver is on any kind of medication that may interfere with their driving?
- Do they use their cell phone or Bluetooth while driving?
- Will you sign the Courage to Intervene Promise? Will you let the driver know you have signed the promise?
